Dear Ms. Buckley:

As ordered by the Commission on May 27, 2026 in Case No. 25-0927-W-S-PC, West Virginia-American Water Company and the Fayette County Commission report that the Commission should proceed to process this case with the agreement as initially filed in that docket. In this letter, the Company and the County Commission also respond to Staff's petition seeking a general investigation of Kanawha Falls Public Service District, docketed as Case No. 26-0569-PSWD-P.

The Company and the County Commission diligently prepared a revised asset purchase agreement and provided it for review, revision and ultimately agreement to all three public service districts. While Armstrong PSD and Page-Kincaid PSD positively engaged with the Company and the County Commission, Kanawha Falls PSD did not. Without meaningful and productive engagement from all of the districts, regrettably the Company and the County Commission must recommend that the Commission proceed with the case as originally filed.

On June 10, 2026, Staff filed its petition in Case No. 26-0569-PSWD-P to start the process of both having Kanawha Falls PSD placed into receivership and removing one of its board members. The Company and the County Commission

are not opposed to a receivership and the efforts to remove the board member and they agree to participate in and support these efforts should the Commission respond favorably to Staff's petition. This process is likely to be lengthy, and in that time sewage will still be running down Cannelton Hollow and Mount Olive Prison will remain at risk of losing water service.

Therefore, the Company and the County Commission believe that the Commission should also proceed in an effort to find the fastest way to resolve these important service issues – whether it be by a receivership, a change in the Kanawha Falls PSD board that allows an agreement that includes all three districts, or by the acquisition as initially filed in Case No. 25-0927-W-S-PC.
